

SUPPORT FOR ENTREPRENEURS

SADC and CAE VIRAGE VERT (GOING GREEN) PROGRAM

The objective of this program is to concretely stimulate the move towards environmentally-friendly practices throughout the regional Quebec eco-system. It allows companies to seek specialized expertise to guide them in improving their environmental and economic performance or to benefit from support for the implementation of collective sustainable development (SD) projects.



INCREASING SUSTAINABLE PROCUREMENT

Johanne Martineau, Boulangerie Merci la vie

"Merci la vie has been working towards a shift to green practices since last year. We created a responsible and sustainable source by growing our own vegetables. In doing so, we were able to develop two summer menu items that come from our land by optimizing our space with a vegetable garden. Not only has our travel decreased, but our raw material costs for these dishes have gone down by almost 50%. With the services of a sustainability consultant, we expect to double the efficiency of the experiment this year. We will be able to create more dishes from our garden over three harvest seasons. With a well-structured optimization plan organized into a timeline, we will be able to increase and even double our responsible sourcing this year."

BUSINESS TRANSFER SERVICES

Since the signing in December 2021 of the three-year (2022-2024) Desjardins Succession Partnership, the Laurentian and Antoine Labelle SADCs have increased their coaching, training and financing services for the acquisition and sale of businesses for entrepreneurs in their region. For the SADC des Laurentides, this partnership has allowed us to exceed the objectives established in advance on our territory.

A SUCCESSFUL ACQUISITION STARTS BY SURROUNDING YOURSELF WITH THE RIGHT PEOPLE

Once they decided to acquire the natural products boutique La Rosée in Mont-Tremblant, the three business owners. Anie. Sébastien and Véronique, met with the SADC des Laurentides. They wanted to make sure they were well prepared and to evaluate the different acquisition and financing scenarios available on the territory. Through meetings and exchanges of confidential information, together we analyzed the historical results of the business, while establishing realistic financial forecasts, taking into account the selling price, the conditions required by the seller, the strong bond of trust between the parties involved, as well as the personal situation of each of them in a Covid context. This approach allowed the three buyers and the seller to take ownership of the best acquisition scenario. They were able to produce a plan of action at the time of entry, defining the corporate role of each party, as well as the post-transaction transition plan with the seller. Another successful acquisition!



BUSINESS MENTORSHIP

The mentoring service is offered in collaboration with the Réseau Mentorat and the support of the Laurentides RCM and the Pays-d'en- Haut RCM. It brings together experienced volunteers who offer their time, guidance
